Smoking... did you know?

- It is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to be sold any tobacco products.
- Shops that do can face prosecution.
- Parents or adults buying for underage children (under18) can also be prosecuted.
- The link between smoking tobacco and cancer is very clear. It causes at least 15 different types of cancer, including two of the most common, lung and bowel cancer and can contribute to heart disease, stroke, diabetes, respiratory infections, complications in pregnancy as well as certain eye diseases.
- The type of nicotine found in tobacco plants is as addictive as cocaine or heroin.
- Passive smoking is dangerous and can cause many of the same diseases as smoking.
- There is good evidence that children are significantly more likely to start smoking themselves if they have family members or live with people who smoke.

- Illegal cigarettes do not self-extinguish and therefore present a higher risk of fire.



Bootleg tobacco - imported without duty being paid.

Fake cigarettes - not regulated, found to contain high levels of tar, dirt and even droppings.

Illicit whites - made in Eastern Europe or Asia, not regulated, found to contain high levels of tar, dirt and even droppings.
