Parents' session

This session is free and open to parents that have a child or young person who has been referred to our SLIP Programme, and to parents of children and young people who haven't been referred to SLIP but where there is a possibility that they could engage in risky behaviours. Risky behaviours include sending or viewing inappropriate and/or explicit images and content and inappropriate behaviours with or towards other young people.

The session aims to support parents by:

- Explaining about Dhiverse and our services.
- Explaining the objectives of the SLIP Programme.
- Helping parents to understand that these types of behaviours are unfortunately not uncommon and are often because young people have little or no understanding of consent and the law and the possible consequences of their behaviours.
- Giving parents tips and information on how they could support their child/young person to understand the consequences of their behaviours.
- Exploring and discussing a case study.
- Explaining when referring to SLIP would be appropriate and how parents can refer.
- Offering free 1-1 follow up support if needed.

Professionals' session

This session is free and open to professionals who work with young people who display harmful sexual behaviours or are at risk of doing so.

The session aims to support professionals by:

- Explaining about Dhiverse and our services.
- Explaining the objectives of the SLIP Programme.
- Helping professionals to understand that these types of behaviours are unfortunately not uncommon and are often because young people have little or no understanding of harmful. sexual behaviours, consent and the law and the consequences of their behaviours.
- Explaining when a referral to SLIP would be appropriate and how to refer.
- Exploring and discussing a case study.
